Minutes of the Minority Cell Meeting held on 25th July 2024

Discussion Points:

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Annual Report of the Minority Cell for the Academic Year 2023-2024

The Minority Cell convened meetings to address concerns of and support to minority students, with discussions focused on the scholarship applications and enhancing support mechanisms. Here is a summary of the discussions held during the meetings on 3rd August 2023:

Meeting on 3rd August 2023 (Principal's Room):

Scholarship Data (2022-23): The Coordinator reported that 4 students availed the 2022-23 Minority Scholarship, amounting to a total disbursed sum of Rs. 35,000/-

Class wise Awareness Campaign: Consideration was given to launch a comprehensive (class wise) campaign to promote awareness about the minority scholarship and encourage eligible candidates to apply.

Identifying Barriers: Efforts were directed towards identifying and addressing any barriers or challenges preventing eligible minority students from applying for scholarships.

Outreach Campaign Development: Plans were made to develop targeted outreach campaigns utilizing various communication channels, including social media, to reach potential applicants and increase awareness about available scholarships.

Scholarship Applications: Concerns were expressed regarding rejections due to failure in meeting eligibility criteria.

Annual Report Summary: On August 3rd, 2023, the Minority Cell convened to discuss supporting minority students. They reviewed scholarship data, highlighting that 4 students received Rs. 35,000 in the previous year. Plans were made to launch class-wise awareness campaigns, identify barriers to application, and develop targeted outreach efforts. Concerns were raised about rejections due to eligibility criteria. The meeting emphasized the need to enhance support for minority students.

- The primary focus of the meeting was on analysing the status of the 2022-23 Minority Scholarship and addressing the critical decline in both applications and approvals for the scholarship. The coordinator presented information regarding the 2022-23 Minority Scholarship, stating that only 4 students availed the benefits, and the total disbursed amount was just Rs. 35,000.
- The committee deliberated on potential reasons for the decline in scholarship applications. Factors such as lack of awareness about the scholarship and changes in eligibility criteria were considered.
- Another point of concern raised during the meeting was the absence of scholarship renewals. Members discussed the importance of retaining scholarship recipients
- The committee decided to launch a comprehensive (class wise) campaign to promote awareness about the minority scholarship and encourage eligible candidates to apply.
